Our wish is for you to enjoy the holidays however you celebrate, and for a peaceful 2024.



A Locust Lane resident, has been a member of the CAMP Chorus since 2008 and a member of the CAMP Chorus Ensemble.


Keri and Jason Filasky

The plow company we hire cannot stop to plow a driveway. The plower also put out snow stakes so they can better drive thru the community with minimal lawn damage. PLEASE do not remove them! They cost \$2 per stake and we end up paying for all those missing stakes.





Honoring Nancy Hecker

This year marks 35 years that Mulberry Lane resident, Nancy Hecker, has served on the Sandy Brae Board. Nancy started serving in 1988, the year she and her late husband Harold moved into the community when it was still under the developer. Always eager to help out, she was recruited by her neighbor, Harry Spencer, to join what was then called, the Sandy Brae Committee. Nancy's task was to be the "welcome wagon" to all the new residents who moved in. She would call and set a time to come visit answering questions from new residents, giving referrals, and leaving behind a folder of brochures and local information, as well as recent meeting minutes from "the committee"/ the HOA Board. She did that for many many years.

Then in 2003, when the residents wanted to have an incorporated HOA, under the guidance of Birch Lane resident, Mike Rooney, Nancy was right there to help make it happen. And ever since then, Nancy has been the official historian for the community and attended every Board meeting until health issues curtailed her attendance. Named Honorary Board Emeritus in 2019, Nancy's community activities have lessened, but she continues to be available to offer guidance and advice to help make her beloved Sandy Brae a great community.

We appreciate you, honor you as our Honorary Board Emeritus, are thankful for all you have done for Sandy Brae, and wish you a Happy 97th Birthday in January 2024.

Dear Homeowners.

As the days get shorter with the coming season, I worry about the elderly and disabled who go for their daily evening walks. I think about the innocent kids walking to and from their bus stops. Our development does not have sidewalks or streetlights. We do not have speed bumps or crosswalks. There are no security entrance gates or perimeter fences. Our community needs to work together to make Sandy Brae safe for all its' residents.

Here is how you can do your part:

- Adhere to the 25mph speed limit and stop at all the stop signs.
- Turn your home exterior lights on, especially between 6pm and 9pm.
- Wear reflective items and lights when walking, biking, or running around the community.
- Trim back trees and bushes that are blocking driver visibility of stop signs, driveways, and around corners.
- Slow down and make eye contact with pedestrians to avoid right-of-way miscommunication.
- Suggest and support safety improvement measures by the HOA.

Above all, look out for your closest neighbors. Exchange names and phone numbers. Let them know if they left their car door, gates or garage door open. Keep watch while they are out of town. With your engagement and support, our neighborhood can continue being a safe and desirable place to live for all residents.
